

ADOLESCENTS WHO USE MARIJUANA ARE AT GREATER RISK OF...

- Risky sexual behavior which can lead to STIs or unplanned pregnancy
- Academic problems (e.g., dropout, increased absences)
- Legal problems, delinquency
- Driving under the influence of MJ more than doubles the risk of an accident
- Increased likelihood of suffering mental illness such as depression, anxiety, psychosis, or other mental illness
- Lowered educational and occupational aspirations

The younger they start, and the more frequently an adolescent uses marijuana, the more likely they are to suffer problems.

9% of those who experiment with marijuana will become addicted About 17% for those who start using as teenagers 25-50% among those who smoke daily Source: Volkow et al., NEIM, 2014.

IS THERE A LINK BETWEEN MARIJUANA USE AND MENTAL ILLNESS?

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- "Several studies have linked marijuana use to increased risk for mental illnesses, including psychosis (schizophrenia), depression, and anxiety, but whether and to what extent it actually causes these conditions is not always easy to determine. The amount of drug used, the age at first use, and genetic vulnerability have all been shown to influence this relationship" (p. 8).

- Existing studies of prenatal exposure to cannabis have shown that babies respond differently to visual stimuli, tremble more, and have a high-pitched cry, which could indicate problems with neurological development.
 About 1/3 of THC in the mother's blood is estimated to cross the placental barrier.
 More research is needed to separate the effects of marijuana from other environmental factors.

Governor Inslee signed into law the Cannabis Patient


Protection Act in April 2015. Highlights:

Medical MJ is added to regulation of all MJ producers, processors, and retail stores under the LCB


Establishes rules for authorizers

Creates a medical MJ authorization database

Establishes a medical MJ consultant certification program










- Medical marijuana refers to the whole unprocessed marijuana plant or its extracts
 Not recognized or approved as medicine by FDA currently
 Researchers are interested specifically in the therapeutic properties of two abundant cannabinoids: THC and CBD.
- CBD moderates the psychoactive effects of THC.











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
